Journey into the FUNtastic!

Weekly themes add a primary focus that helps keep camp new and refreshing for campers attending multiple weeks. All weeks are packed with swimming, games, songs and exciting activities, so we recommend choosing those that work best with your summer schedule and when possible, sign up for consecutive weeks. We offer so many activities that you would have to attend all summer to participate in them all.

Research shows that camp is a vital component of child and youth development and campers attending consecutive weeks experience greater skill development, higher self-esteem and stronger group bonds. Camp is more than participating in cool activities . . . it's about becoming part of a community, fostering teamwork, trying new things, experiencing successes as well as failures, learning how to

interact with peers and making new friends. Campers often start gaining confidence in themselves and their abilities, but before they embrace full achievement, they are off to their next summer activity and have to start the developmental process all over again. Enrolling for consecutive weeks helps your child experience the success that he or she earns.

Our recipe for a FUN summer combines a dynamic staff and energetic campers with a 52-acre campus that includes three swimming pools, multipurpose court, outdoor amphitheater, hillside slide, game fields, pond, climbing tower, zipline, archery range, low ropes course, woods and log buildings. Some activities have age requirements. Swimming is provided to all campers and instructional swimming is included for children ages 3-8. Hold on tight, the FUN is just beginning!

Age Groups at a Glance

Discovery Camp [ages 3 through entering 1st grade] A unique environment created precisely for our youngest campers. Children are placed into specific groups based on age/grade and participate in many camp activities under the close supervision of our nurturing counselors. The low camper-to-counselor ratio ensures that all campers receive the support and assurance they need for a successful camp experience. A sampling of activities includes swim instruction, arts and crafts, sing-alongs, sandbox play, outdoor games, nature activities, center play, zipline and hillside slide. Children entering the first grade also have the opportunity to go boating. All campers must be completely potty trained and at least age three by June 1. To provide a quality experience, we recommend all three-year olds attend a minimum of two or more weeks during the summer and we strongly recommend that these weeks be consecutive.

Explorer Camp [entering grades 2nd-5th] Explorer campers are always looking for fun and challenging experiences and we provide it! Campers are grouped by grade level with rising second and third graders together and rising fourth and fifth graders together. Excellent counselor role models provide supervision, guidance and encouragement. Due to the large variety of activities, explorer campers get to choose their activities. Some of the activities include swimming, arts and crafts, archery, boating, zipline, nature study, group initiatives, outdoor games, sports, drama, dance and more. Rising fourth graders, and older, have opportunities to sign up for the climbing tower, marksmanship, and our tree climbing program.

Adventure Camp [entering grades 6th-8th] The ultimate in middle school-based camping. There are plenty of activities that vary by week including woodworking, drama, challenge games, sports, camp crafts, the climbing tower, zipline, tree climbing, wilderness survival skills and other options, but what really makes adventure camp so popular is the group bonding time, peer relationships and camaraderie with staff. Under the leadership of active staff role models, adventurers are a tight knit team and thrive on getting to choose their groups based on the weekly activities.

Counselor-In-Training [entering grades 9th-10th] This leadership training program incorporates real life work experience into a fun and energetic camp environment. Through hands-on work, team building and problem solving, CITs learn life skills that they will keep forever.
